Dear Habitat supporters and friends:

Last year (2014) marked the 28th year of Habitat for Humanity of Greater New Haven's founding. Our organization serves New Haven County low-income families and works to stabilize and revitalize neighborhoods. None of the work that is carried out by Habitat's board of directors, staff and volunteers would be possible without the support of the local community. **Every dollar, every in-kind donation to the construction program or ReStore, is important. Thank you for your contribution.** Whether you donated for the first time in 2014 or you are a long-time supporter, please know that your support is needed, appreciated, and directly benefits your local community.

In 2014, the organization continued its home building plan in the Hill North Neighborhood of New Haven. Together, Habitat's construction staff, hundreds of community volunteers, and future homeowners, built homes or laid the foundation to build on Greenwood Street, Russell Street, and Vernon Street. In Beaver Hills, the organization continued progress on a Habitat home on Sherman Parkway. A significant move made by the organization in 2014 was to lay the groundwork for moving into a new neighborhood in New Haven, the Fair Haven Neighborhood. In response to community members and the desire of Habitat families to live in Fair Haven, the organization began developing home building sites on East Grand Avenue, Russell Street, and Poplar Street. We also broke ground on a Habitat home in the Quinnipiac Meadows Neighborhood, near East Haven, on Hawthorne Road.

Future homeowners, Habitat's professional construction staff, and more than 2,000 volunteers per year from Greater New Haven, join together to build Habitat homes. Your dollars fund their efforts. Thank you for helping us to break the cycle of poverty by making it possible to offer the opportunity of homeownership to qualified families.

I encourage you to keep in touch with the organization. One of the best ways to get news is to sign up for email updates or check the website regularly for news, www.habitatgnh.org. The organization also has an active Facebook page (search Habitat for Humanity of Greater New Haven). If it is at all possible, **I hope you will attend a dedication of a Habitat home.** Each time the organization finishes a home, we hold a ceremony transferring in a symbolic way the ownership of the home from Habitat to the new homeowners. Dedications are open to the public, and they are advertised through email blasts and on the website. You will have the opportunity to tour the home and meet the family who will live in it. Come and see what your donations have created and experience the joy and happiness of a Habitat family. It is the best way to see what your donations, the hammers of hundreds of volunteers, the future homeowners, and Habitat's small dedicated staff can do together.

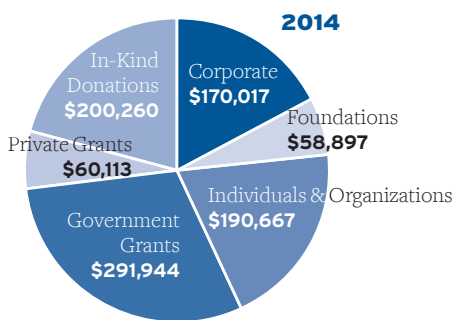

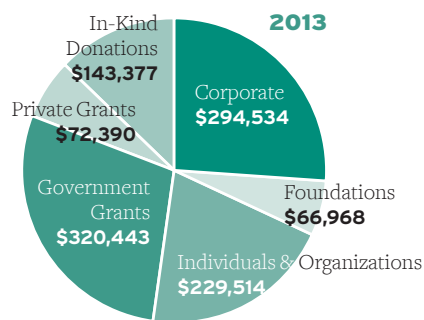

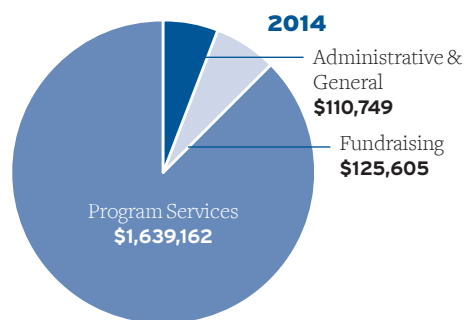


Total Contributions: **\$971,900**

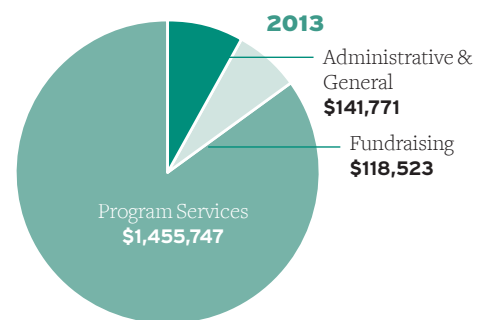


Total Contributions: **\$1,127,226**

Habitat for Humanity of Greater New Haven is a volunteer-driven organization. We accomplish our mission of building high quality, energy-efficient, affordable housing for qualified low income families using primarily volunteer labor. Volunteers of all ages and backgrounds donate thousands of hours annually to construction, office administration, ReStore operation, partnering with Habitat families, warehouse organization, event planning, fundraising and Board membership. Since our founding in 1986, our faithful volunteers have enabled us to build or rehabilitate 94 homes! We extend our deepest thanks to everyone who volunteered for Habitat in 2014.

HOME BUILDING VOLUNTEERS

Most of Habitat's volunteer opportunities in 2014 were on the home building sites. We are particularly indebted to a faithful band of "regulars" who have volunteered with us for years and who come out one or more times a week, regardless of weather. Their skills, commitment and good cheer are an inspiration. Another crucial component of the volunteer program is made up of volunteers sent by Habitat home sponsors in 2014—ConnectiCare, Knights of Columbus, People's United Community Foundation, Travelers, Webster Bank, and our two long-standing community-based sponsor groups, Raise the Roof and Sleeping Giant Build.

The value of the combined commitment of providing funding and volunteers to build Habitat homes is immeasurable. Each year a large number of groups contact Habitat in order to schedule "build days". In 2014, more than 75 groups signed up.

COMMUNITY BUILDS

Raise the Roof and Sleeping Giant Build, both community-based house sponsor groups, are two of Habitat's most important partners. Every year these two vibrant groups recruit dozens of volunteers, primarily from congregations, civic groups and businesses. Community build volunteers raise substantial funds to build Habitat homes; they also provide the majority of labor needed to build them. Raise the Roof built its tenth Habitat home in 2014 and Sleeping Giant completed its

sixth home. There is no better symbol of "community" than watching members of these two organizations in action.

WOMEN BUILD

Habitat for Humanity of Greater New Haven continues to promote the involvement of women in the construction of Habitat homes. In May 2014, more than 30 female volunteers participated in National Women Build Week, a collaborative effort between Habitat International and Lowe's Home Improvement, which sponsors the event. Women from the Congregational Church in South Glastonbury and Sikorsky participated in the Women Build along with numerous individual volunteers, Habitat staff and Habitat homebuyers.

HABITAT RESTORE

Launched in 2013, the New Haven County ReStore in Wallingford is a donation-based retail store open to the general public. The proceeds of the ReStore benefit HfHGNNH. The store is staffed primarily with volunteers who assist with customer service, sort donated goods and organize furniture displays.

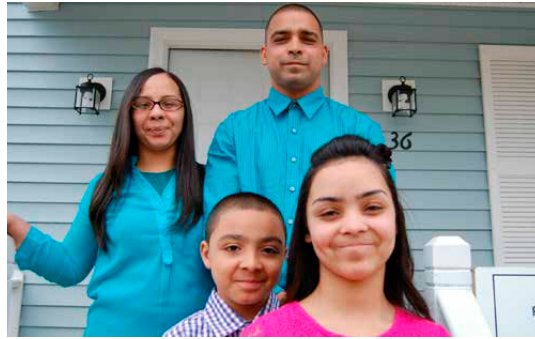
VOLUNTEERS IN OTHER CAPACITIES

HfHGNNH's Board of Directors and Advisory Council are comprised entirely of volunteers. These individuals, often long-time Habitat supporters, invest a great deal of time during a multi-year commitment. Community volunteers also serve on several crucial committees which deal with property acquisition, construction planning and building. In addition, volunteers from the Board of Directors take the lead in the organization's family selection process as well as providing partnership for future homeowners as they go through the home building and buying process. A core of extremely important volunteers works side by side with the staff in maintaining the warehouse, processing thank you letters for donors, helping to plan special events, as well as performing administrative tasks.

Habitat for Humanity of Greater New Haven is grateful for the outpouring of volunteer support in 2014.

HABITAT BUILDS GREEN AND FORTIFIED!

Our organization makes it a priority to build Habitat homes that are energy efficient, environmentally friendly and can withstand major storms. Habitat homes are built using the highest Energy Star standards, and each home is tested and rated by an independent energy specialist. Aside from reducing the home's environmental footprint, the savings are passed on to the homebuyer. In response to the increasing number of storms in our area, we partnered with Travelers to adopt the Fortified Home Gold Building Standards. Travelers chose our organization as the model in the Northeast for demonstrating how housing developers can combine higher building standards with affordable housing development.

HELPING VETERANS

The organization has created a new program, Veteran Build, that provides homeownership opportunities specifically for veterans in need. Each year we will designate a Habitat home building project as a Veteran Build Habitat home.

Because we design and build our own homes we are able to accommodate



special physical needs. The home site has been chosen: 201 East Grand Avenue in New Haven. The owner will be Veteran Cheryl Eberg. The major sponsors for the project are Liberty Bank and Medtronic.

WHO WE ARE

Habitat for Humanity of Greater New Haven is an affiliate of Habitat International. Habitat International's mission is to eliminate poverty housing around the world and to make adequate housing a matter of conscience and action. Habitat welcomes to the table partners who are willing to pick up a hammer and help improve the lives of families in need.

WHAT WE DO

Habitat affiliates build and renovate houses in partnership with people in need, and then sell the homes to the homeowner partners. Homeowners are selected based on their need for housing, ability to repay a 25-year, 0% interest mortgage and willingness to partner with Habitat. Because of Habitat's no-profit loans and because the houses are principally built with volunteer labor, mortgage payments are affordable for low-income families.

(Habitat for Humanity of Greater New Haven is an independently incorporated 501(c)(3) non-profit volunteer organization supported primarily by donations from the local community.)

THE HABITAT HOMEOWNERSHIP PROGRAM

Habitat's mission is to eliminate poverty housing by building simple, decent houses for low-income working families. Our homeownership program is based upon the concept of partnership. By offering a 25-year, zero percent mortgage and pre-ownership counseling, Habitat enables families who do not qualify for a conventional mortgage to become long-term successful homeowners. Program applicants go through a lengthy application process. Partner families are selected on the basis of need for housing, employment history, credit worthiness, ability to repay the mortgage, agreement to adhere to our program guidelines, and willingness to complete 400 hours of "sweat equity" helping to build their own and other Habitat homes.
